Gardening Tips and Hints

Leaf Mould

utumn is here. It will soon be time to dig out those rakes and collect those leaves. To grow strong, healthy plants we need a good soil structure. We ask a lot from our soil - good aeration, optimum water holding capacity and with adequate drainage - to allow the roots to take up water, oxygen and the food they need. Leaf mould is made from the rotted leaves of deciduous trees and is invaluable in maintaining that desirable open structure. It is also free! Compost the leaves separately in a mesh cage (4 poles and chicken wire) or simply stick in black bags and pierce with plenty of holes. In 2

Hiring of Garvald Hall


