I think it would be good to alert people about the budget crises that the county is entering into and the opportunity to comment provided by the Council's consultation document:

The council are proposing to reduce Education & Community Services departments' share of the budget. The budget for these services will be cut each year for at least the next 3 years. All services have this year suffered "efficiency savings" and there is little room left for more cuts. In education, if these proposed cuts are endorsed, they will certainly lead to further teacher cuts and rising class sizes.

The Administration promised to support the vulnerable and to improve the education of our children in their document "Our Contract with the People". It's difficult to understand how these promises can now be fulfilled when the budgets are about to be cut. See:


