GMCC Broadband Upgrades Programme 2011

The broadband group has designed an **1** upgrade for the existing broadband service, with potential speeds of up to 20 Mbits/sec. This design takes advantage of the many advances in technology that have become available since the original system was installed. The cost of the upgrade, which would cover a much larger area, including East Linton and Gifford, is a 6 figure sum. A summary document is available at http:// www.iasmith.com/bbProposal.pdf.

There have been further recent expressions of interest from other villages in East Lothian. Expansion to additional areas of the county could certainly follow successful completion of the initial project. We are by no means the only rural community who do not have access to adequate broadband services.

The group originally applied to the EU financed Broadband Challenge fund. Unfortunately it was over subscribed and the group were unsuccessful. The group have now submitted their proposal for the March round of Leader funding. All fingers are crossed!

If successful, the Garvald and Morham Community Council broadband group will transform itself into an "industrial and provident society cooperative" where all members of the community will be able to become shareholders.

If unsuccessful, the award of money

from the Crystal Rig wind farm will be used to upgrade the existing system to up to 6 Mbits/sec.
