Plant Sale

Our annual sale will take place in the Village Hall commencing at 10.00 a.m. on Saturday 19 May. As well as herbaceous plants, herbs and vegetables, there will be a large variety of annual plants for sale. It would be hugely appreciated if members would donate spare plants. These might be seedlings, cuttings or herbaceous plants they have grown or divided. Please ensure pots are reasonably clean and plants labelled where possible. Donations may be handed in to the Hall on the **previous evening between 6.00 p.m. and 7 p.m. or before 9.30 a.m.** on the morning of the sale to allow time for pricing and placing, or contact the Secretary, Jeanie Cole, to make alternative arrangements.

Summer Outing

Our outing this year on Friday 8 June includes two fascinating gardens in Fife. A booking form can be found at the end of this newsletter.

Wemyss Castle (www.wemysscastlegardens.com) Fife

This is a woodland garden with rare trees, plus a 6-acre walled garden, covered in climbing roses and clematis, with borders divided into sections containing colour-coordinated perennials and pleached hornbeams. Around the castle are woodland areas planted with narcissus, scilla, bluebells and *Erythronium revolutum*. Lunch is likely to be at Kingsbarns Distillery, who provided such good sandwiches and cakes last year!

Wormistoune House (www.wormistoune.com) Fife

This 17th century tower house and walled garden that has been lavishly restored and extended, simultaneously traditional and contemporary. The walled garden is divided into sections including a double herbaceous border, a moon window looking over Fife Ness and bordered by two ponds joined by a rill. Outside is a lavender and box parterre, a shady area beneath four *Griselina* underplanted with ferns, a wildflower meadow full of fritillaries, cowslips and orchids, and newly developed areas.

Gifford Village Open Gardens

A selection of local gardens, including Broadwoodside, will open under the Scotland's Garden Scheme Charity on Sunday 8 July from 1.00 p.m. – 5.00 p.m. Entry fee £6.00. Teas will be available in the Village Hall with all teas monies going to the Teapot Trust charity. Flower Show

Our annual Flower Show will take place on the Village Green on the weekend of 18 and 19 August and is one of the longest running Flower Shows in Scotland. Schedules will be available from various venues in the county and all the information is available on our website. As in recent years, there will also be local craft stalls, face painting and delicious teas served in the Village Hall on both days. This year, a Children's Novelty Dog Show will run on the Saturday in the area behind the marquee.

For the past six years, Joe Clark has been running a **Plant Sale** during our Flower Show in August. The sale is greatly enhanced by members and neighbours contributing plants. Now is the time to consider what you might be able to donate as you divide or pot up plants. Shrubs, herbaceous and house plants will all be greatly appreciated, particularly if they might be blooming in August.

Other News

Gifford Horticultural Society is a Charitable Trust and as such, it is recommended that it does not accumulate excessive cash in its bank account. In recent years we have donated £500 annually to a local charity. This year it was agreed by the Committee to increase the amount donated. In keeping with our Constitution to support other local charitable bodies, promote our Society and offer education in the practice and knowledge of gardening, the following donations were made:

- 1. The Gifford Lunch Club received £500. Jane Steven, Chairwoman of the Committee, set this club up at the end of last year with a view to combat loneliness and act as an opportunity to socialise for those in this area who may feel isolated. At present the group meets monthly in the Goblin Ha for a light lunch where outings and entertainment events are arranged and the Gifford Horticultural Society's events promoted.
- 2. Amisfield Walled Garden is one of Scotland's largest walled gardens. It is managed by the Amisfield Preservation Trust and a large band of volunteers. It provides a venue for education and training for people of all abilities. They will receive a £500 donation which they plan to utilise to plant a Winter Garden with the aim of providing interest all year round. In return, we anticipate they will offer our members a talk, a guided visit to these gardens and an educational pruning workshop.
- 3. East Coast F(107.6FM) is a registered charity and a community radio station. It won a Princess Royal Training Award last year for assisting in the training of individuals who are young and unemployed and those who live with special needs. They will receive a £600 donation which will sponsor a Country Music Show. In turn they will promote the Gifford Horticultural Society and allow us to share gardening knowledge, advice and tips on their shows. Sarah Curtis, our President, will organise participation in these broadcasts and invite other horticulturalists to get involved.
